Marital Changes After Retirement

If you marry after you retire, you can change your Retiree Life Only or Guaranteed Term benefit option to a Survivor Lifetime option that provides a monthly death benefit to your new spouse. Or, if you retired under a Survivor Lifetime option and your original beneficiary dies and you remarry, you can also make this change.

You may be eligible to change your retirement option if you divorce after retirement. If you divorce after you retire, you have one year after the date of your marriage to your new spouse to change your retirement option.

Legislature Provides Cities with a new Repeating COLA Option

In May, the Texas Legislature amended the TMRS Act to provide participating cities with another repeating COLA option. The new option allows cities to calculate a COLA by only going back to the change in the Consumer Price Index for one year rather than to the actual date of the employee's retirement.

You don't need to do anything. A city does not have to adopt the new repeating COLA option, and there will be no change in your current COLA unless your city adopts a COLA change. No matter what, your current monthly benefit cannot be reduced.

Cities have three years (2023-2025) during which to adopt the new option. So far, 16 cities have adopted the new COLA: Addison, Alvarado, Andrews, Azle, Brookshire, Bunker Hill Village, Childress, Corpus Christi, Del Rio, Eagle Pass, Fairview, Gonzales, Memorial Villages

Police Department, Oak Point, Pasadena, South Houston, West Columbia, and Willow Park.

TMRS will mail your Form 1099-R to you by January 31. You can also view and print your Form 1099-R in MyTMRS under the Documents tab.

If you are a retired public safety officer and enrolled in the HELPS program, TMRS will mail you a letter in January 2024 stating the amount of 2023 insurance premium payments issued by TMRS.

- You return to work for the same city from which you retired more than one year after you retired.
